These walls will talk through the art installations and intimate moments curated throughout the spaces. Let us buy you a drink and tell you the stories of The Countrypolitan.




Reception Lounge - Featured Artwork

Original painting on glass by musician and painter Chris Coleman, inspired by Nudie Suit fashion and the Countrypolitan era. His use of a transfer technique gives a more "polished" line on the glass, so it embodies the Countrypolitan polished sound. The ambiguous subjects, their wardrobes, hair styles, and musical instruments are all thoughtfully representative of the notable era in music, as well as a subtle nod to the Nashville culture, where Chris calls home.







David Kammerzell was born in Houston, TX but was raised and lives in Denver, CO. He attended Arizona State University and Metropolitan State College in Denver studying Fine Art. In the mid '80's he began a career as an illustrator. He had many clients including Coors, Playboy, and Keystone Ski Resort. In the early 90's he began working in television creating graphic animations for CBS Channel 4 in Denver. Three years later he moved to Starz, a premium cable network that has more than 17 channels. David received many industry awards there including regional Emmys. He was promoted several times, eventually to the Department Head. During all of that time David painted on the side whenever time would allow. Early in 2013, after nearly 20 years at Starz, he left his position there to pursue painting full time.

Kammerzell paints vintage cowboys, objects, landscapes, figures, and collage-type imagery infused with a distinctly romantic, contemporary-nostalgic air. He seeks to put the viewer in a time machine, but one where the boundaries of memory and longing are blurred. Is that the way it really was? Or do we wish to remember it that way?

All of his paintings are grounded in visually strong compositions and executed in vibrant colors. He is influenced by pop culture and the great illustrators of the early 20th century. Either overtly or subtly, these influences are usually prevalent.



A conceptual assemblage of Nudie Suit-inspired textile panels in a variety of shapes and sizes are displayed across the corner walls just outside the Mr. Guitar meeting room.

These panels were created using found embroidered / embellished fabrics from vintage garments & wardrobes. Textile compositions feature a combination of the iconic shapes seen on classic Nudie Suits, including southern motifs like the horseshoe and the tulip, and other designs influenced by the legendary Nudie Suits give the pieces a special flare.

Selection of unframed pieces – textiles wrapped around cradled wood panels accentuate the high-quality materials and textures from all sides.












